On behalf of the Board and Staff of North York Arts (NYA), we would like to take this opportunity to thank all our supporters in 2019! We continued to build our arts services and programming in North York, provided opportunities for local artists, fostered and strengthened new partnerships, and engaged in more community events. We are very proud of our achievements and our continued efforts to establish a more inclusive, engaged, and sustainable arts and culture community in North York.

In 2019, we launched new programs in the community including **Drum to DJ**, a high-quality, 12-week contemporary music program for youth in two high schools; and **Northbound Exhibition Program**, a juried visual art program that showcased nine exhibitions by emerging artists at the Meridian Arts

Centre and North York Centre.
This year also marked a
continuation of our seniors
community programming with the
Legacy Collective (a North Yorkbased seniors engagement initiative)
based at North York Community
House, and Sunday Serenades—
a big band concert series at Mel
Lastman Square. And finally, we
sold out our inaugural fundraising
event, Beers & Brushes.

This year, NYA created a board and staff development program called **Arts Connect**. Arts Connect was designed to address how NYA, as an arts service organization, could better incorporate recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission to support the process of decolonization and building right relations with Indigenous communities.

As we move into the new decade ahead, NYA will continue to work in collaboration with City Councillors, the City's Economic Development and Culture Division, artists, arts organizations, community stakeholders and our sister LASOs to provide arts programming and services outside the downtown core of Toronto. We will also continue to develop more partnerships with the public, business, educational and social sectors, as we begin to develop our next strategic plan for 2021-2024.

Finally, we would like to thank our amazing Board of Directors, staff, interns, volunteers and programming partners for all their hard work and unwavering dedication to our organization. And we are truly grateful for the financial investment we have received this year from all our public

funders, sponsors and donors that have enabled our community programming and events yearround.



# NORTHBOUND EXHIBITION PROGRAM

In 2019 NYA launched our formal juried exhibition program - Northbound. This professional development program, free for artists and participants, showcased a total of nine exhibitions at the Meridian Arts Centre and North York Centre. The program prioritized new-generation artists, newcomer artists, and artists with a connection to the North York community.



## **BEERS & BRUSHES**

Beers & Brushes was our inaugural (sold-out!) fundraising event in October 2019. The room was full of artists, community members, donors, and friends. The event was a casual reception with different activities, food and local talents held at the Amsterdam Brewery in North York. It was all about coming together to showcase, celebrate, and support North York's vast arts and culture sector. We are so thankful to everyone who supported us in making this night such a success. All proceeds from the event went directly towards NYA's programs.

## **DRUM TO DJ**


Led by Benjamin De Graaf of Love Music Initiative, From the Drum to the DJ is an after-school hands-on music program that explores the influence of African and Afro-Caribbean/Latinx drumming traditions on the evolution of hip-hop music, turntablism, and popular culture today.

Thanks to the support of the Department of Canadian Heritage, there will be two more instalments of the program in 2020 and 2021.

## **ART CONNECTS**

Art Connects was a cultural competency training program for NYA staff, board, and community partners funded by the Department of Canadian Heritage. Through a series of consultations with members of the Indigenous community, NYA asked: "As a non-Indigenous organization, what can we do to support the process of truth and reconciliation?" This led to several outcomes including the development of a new land acknowledgment; and an organizational commitment to authenticity, education, and balance.





# TREASURER'S REPORT

It is with great pleasure that I present the Treasurer's Report for the fiscal year of January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019. The financial highlights exhibited have been audited by the firm of Hogg, Shain & Sheck.


In 2019, North York Arts continued to maintain the appropriate governance and administrative infrastructure to support the growth of the organization. Our main sources of funding remained stable and our public funding increased from all three levels of government to support new programs and specialized community projects.

Moreover, North York Arts produced our inaugural fundraising event in October 2019, which was a great success. While raising money for the organization, we also created and strengthened relationships with donors and corporate sponsors.


We recognize that a large percentage of revenues are still from the public sector, so we will continue to cultivate our corporate sponsors, individual donors and earned revenue streams to strengthen the revenue capacity for the long-term financial sustainability organization. One of our steps to achieve the latter was to hire a fundraising consultant for 2020 to guide the organization's fundraising strategies.

I like to take this opportunity to specifically extend my gratitude to the North York Arts Board of Directors, staff, and the Finance and Audit Committee for their exceptional commitment and work this past year. As well, I like to thank Young and Associates, and Hogg, Shain & Scheck who ensured that all financial matters are managed with care, integrity, and consistency.

# LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that North York is the traditional land of the Huron-Wendat, the Seneca, Haudenosaunee and most recently, the Mississaugas of the Credit River. We also acknowledge that Toronto is covered by treaty 13.

This territory is the subject of the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, a treaty between the Anishinaabe, Mississaugas, and Haudenosaunee that bound them to share the territory and protect the land. Subsequent Indigenous Nations and peoples, settlers and all newcomers, have been invited into this treaty in the spirit of peace, friendship and respect.

North York Arts recognizes that truth and reconciliation is a continuous process and while this land acknowledgement is a crucial step, our organization has much more work to do. By adhering to our values and leading with authenticity, we are committed to building positive relationships with Indigenous peoples, the wider community, and the environment.
