

# LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT




We acknowledge that North York is the traditional land of the Huron-Wendat, the Seneca, Haudenosaunee and most recently, the Mississaugas of the Credit River. We also acknowledge that Toronto is covered by treaty 13.

This territory is the subject of the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, a treaty between the Anishinaabe, Mississaugas, and Haudenosaunee that bound them to share the territory and protect the land. Subsequent Indigenous Nations and peoples, settlers and all newcomers, have been invited into this treaty in the spirit of peace, friendship and respect.

North York Arts recognizes that truth and reconciliation is a continuous process and while this land acknowledgement is a crucial step, our organization has much more work to do. By adhering to our values and leading with authenticity, we are committed to building positive relationships with Indigenous peoples, the wider community, and the environment.

We aim to create shared spaces where we honour art as an expression of spirit and a platform for storytelling. We will continue to educate and be educated, and we will strive for balance in all of our relations. By creating these opportunities, it is our hope that we foster a more inclusive, engaged, and sustainable North York community for generations to come.

### Integrity


We consistently uphold our core values and our organizational responsibilities with the highest level of honesty, openness, and respect.

# A MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD CHAIR & EXECUTIVE DRECTOR

2021 marks North York Arts' 10th anniversary! During this milestone year, we at North York Arts (NYA) celebrated our past and set course for a new future, while maintaining our commitment to connecting our communities to the arts and to each other through our programming. A few highlights from this past year:

 NYA's Northbound exhibition program offered emerging North York-based artists the opportunity to participate in their first professional, curated exhibition - providing them with financial support of their artwork, mentorship in their professional practice and promotion of their work.

- The Animation Project taught seniors stop motion animation over Zoom. Participants learned artistic skills and increased their digital literacy.
- NYA's 10th year anniversary virtual exhibition engaged 30+ arts workers, including 10 commissions. A comprehensive review of the past ten years is available on our website!
- With the Mapping Our Neighbourhoods program
  we engaged youth from Jane and Finch to create
  an interactive, online map, illustrated by youth and
  accompanied by audio descriptions of their
  favourite local spots! The map is also viewable on
  NYA's website.



While continuing to build on successful past programming, NYA also acknowledges the need for continued work to improve equity in the arts and our reconciliation with Indigenous communities. While adhering to our values and leading with authenticity, NYA will continue to work towards being better allies to Indigenous, Black, POC, 2SLGBTQ+ folx and other equity deserving communities.

We could not do what we do without support from our incredible Board of Directors, staff, interns, volunteers and programming partners. We wish to extend our sincere thanks for their



hard work and unwavering dedication and resiliency over the past year. NYA's Board of Directors provided leadership as we navigated a number of transitions in NYA staff. The NYA board committees worked hard to revise financial policies, develop new fundraising strategies, and recruit new board members. NYA staff worked tirelessly to deliver exciting, community-focussed programs to residents of North York.


Our community programming and year-round events could not exist without this integral support.



In these 10 years, we have engaged with hundreds of artists. The artist commissions provided us with an opportunity to highlight their work and to give these artists the space to tell us what NYA means to them within each of their art forms, emotions, perspectives, and feelings.



Julián Carvajal, our 10th-anniversary producer, had the opportunity to interview the CEO and President of the Toronto Arts Foundation and Arts Council, first Board Member of the organization, community consultants, and seven others who have been an integral part of North York Arts. Each week, we featured a podcast that offered our community the opportunity to learn about North York Arts and its beginnings and impact through the voices of influential members of our network. # MAPPING OUR NEIGHBOURHOODS


In the Summer of 2021, we produced a program where four artists and youth from the Jane and Finch and Black Creek neighbourhoods gathered over 6 sessions to give North York a glimpse into their neighbourhood.

With the mentorship of Daniel Rotsztain, participants were invited to create an interactive online map, illustrated entirely by our youth participants. This map was also accompanied by audio descriptions of

their favourite local spots, and each participant wrote a personal narrative about the community they call home. Loocresha GD, Mindy H, Navpreet S and Shristi R have created a work of art that shows what this neighbourhood means to the people who live there.

# NORTHBOUND ART EXHIBIT

We had the chance to work with five emerging North York based artists in the digital realm to create a one-of-a-kind online exhibition featuring new work by Anna Kavemehr, Ashley Beerdat, Meraki Project, Aqsah Shah, and Anahita Akhevan.

Our artists explored themes of isolation, separation, and the changing world of the pandemic at a time when the artistic landscapes was uncertain.

These artists were given the opportunity to participate in their first professional, curated

exhibition and were provided with financial support of their artwork, mentorship in their professional practice and promotion of their work.


# THE ANIMATION PROJECT

We were very excited for the opportunity to team up with the Toronto Animation Image Society (TAIS) to present our second edition of The Animation Project.



The Disabled List/Accessible Futures invited us to rethink access as an organization, and dedicate real time and effort to making everyday changes that can meet the access needs of a broader audience.



It is with great pleasure that I present the Treasurer's Report for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2021. The financial highlights presented have been audited by the firm of Hogg, Shain & Scheck.

Due to the incredible and continued support from our funders and donors in the public and private sectors, NYA has been financially supported throughout 2021. This has been the second year of a global pandemic that has been particularly hard on the arts community, and we are grateful for this support. Like many other arts organizations, our community programming has remained online throughout the year. Also, due to our healthy cash

position, the Board has set aside additional funds to increase the foundational operational reserve. This will ensure that North York Arts remains financially resilient in the future.




